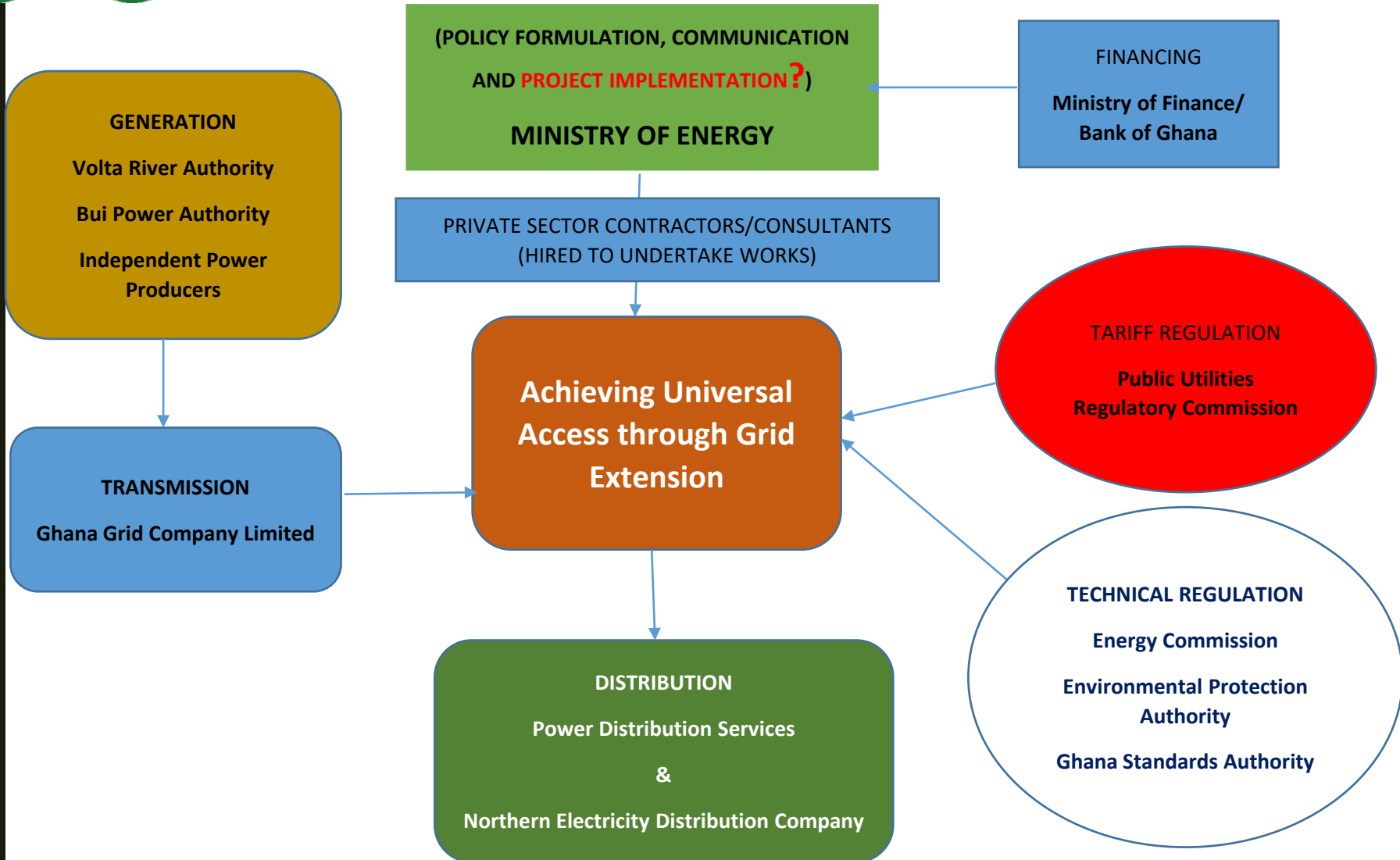

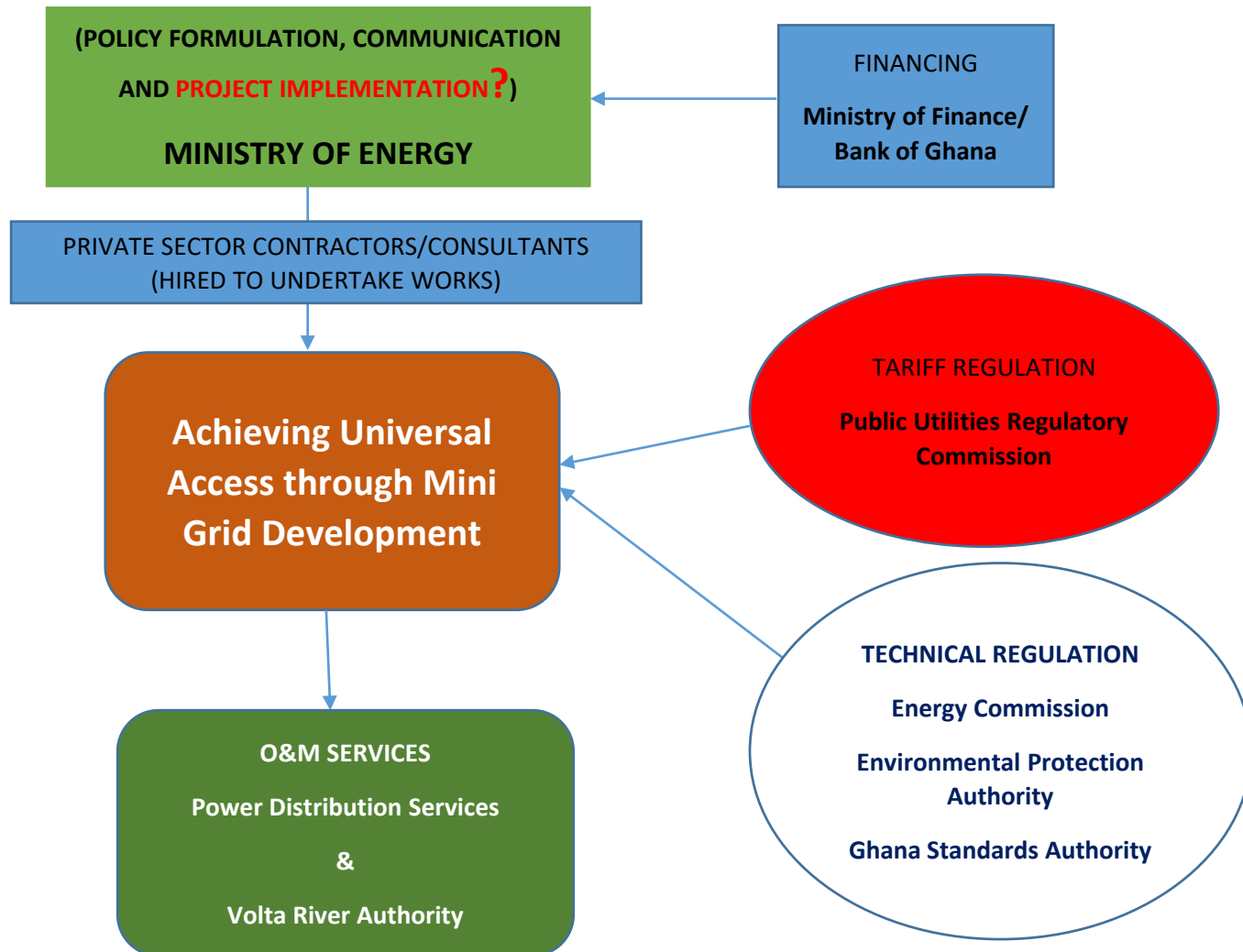


# Institutional Arrangement for Grid Extension



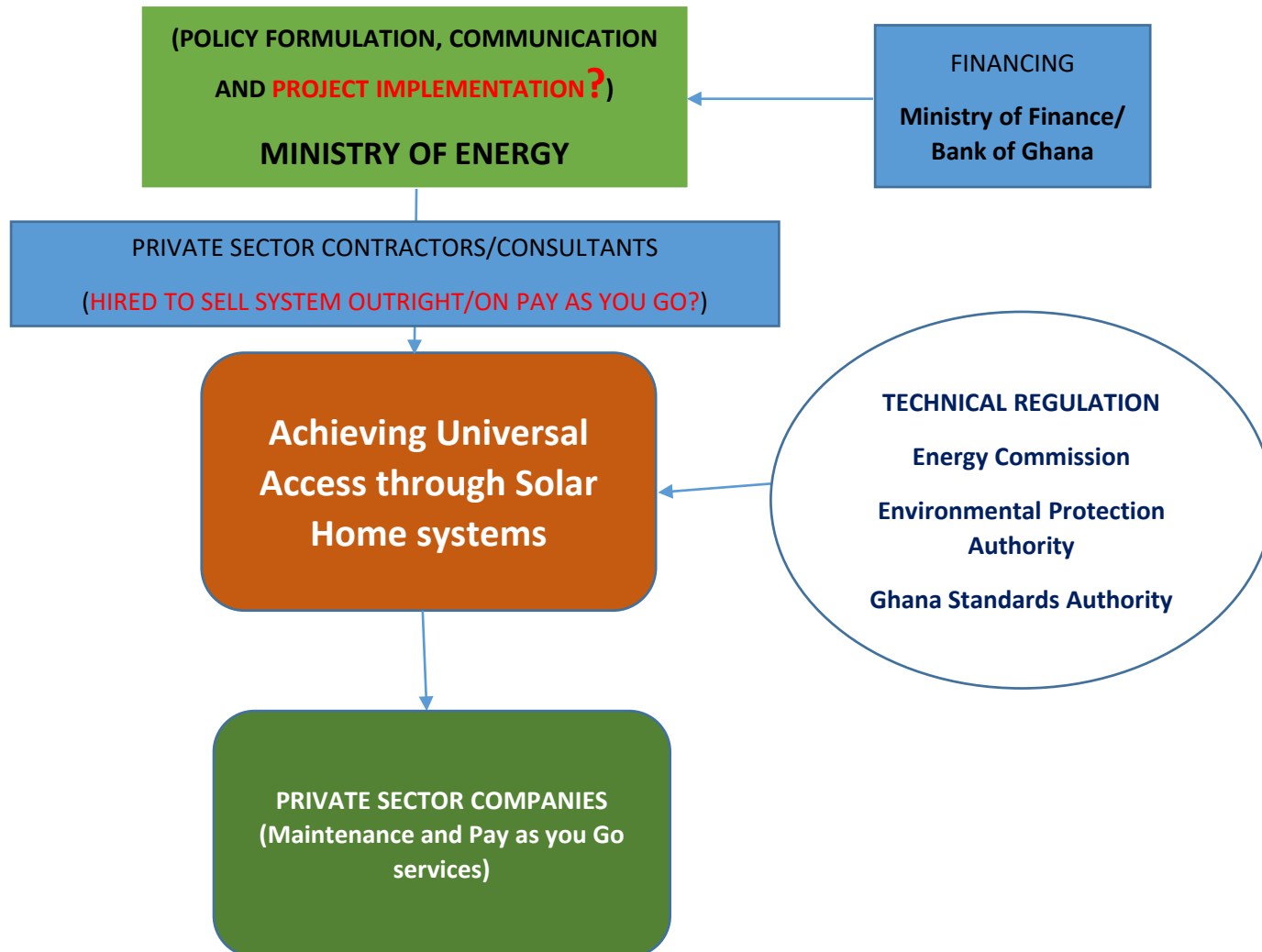


# Institutional Arrangement for Mini-Grid Systems

5. Should the PURC regulate the prices charged by Pay as you go SHS for electricity in communities?
